Message from the President H.K.L.B.A.

Once again, we have completed a very full and successful year of lawn bowls, with development, administration and on the playing front.

Our game of lawn bowls, although still very much a minority sport, is beginning to move forward with outdoor greens at Shatin due for completion this year and others planned for Taipo, Tuen Mun and Tin Shui Wai. The indoor game has also made progress in the form of "Short Mat", and is now becoming widely played in the Urban and Regional Councils' Recreation Centres. I have always maintained that, given the facilities, our sport in Hong Kong will take off. This, to a certain extent, is exactly what is happening.

During the year, we managed to organise a very successful Classic which brought an outstanding field to our shores and included ladies for the first time. We saw some tremendous matches, no more so than the "never-to-be-forgotten" Singles Final.

Our new full time Sports Executive took up office during the year to relieve the pressure on Association Officers, and although he has since moved on to other things, his successor has recently taken up the reins. This is in time for our move into Sports House at Soo Kun Po together with the H.K.L.L.B.A.. This move should herald better facilities for both ourselves and the ladies.

On the international front, our team went to Victoria, B.C., Canada for the 5th Pacific Championships in August 1993 and came back with Silver in the Fours and Bronze in the Pairs, once again, a very creditable performance. Also, and for the first time in Hong Kong, a three match Test Series was held in December against a very competent Australian Under-25s Team. Whilst the visitors won the series, it did give an opportunity for a number of local bowlers to experience such competition and for that must be considered a success.

Domestically, our league competitions, both summer and winter, have been completed with little difficulty and my sincere thanks to Brian Poynton and his Panel for all their efforts and efficiency throughout the season. Likewise, Vincent Cheung and his Panel have accomplished another difficult task with relative ease in organising the National Championships. To these two Officers and indeed to all members of the General Committee, my sincere thanks for your support and cooperation in ensuring that our sport continues to be organised with great efficiency. It would be wrong not to make particular mention of Bob Gartan, who as Hon. Secretary, has put in many extra hours and a lot of effort during the absence of a Sports Executive. The Association is indeed fortunate to have such a dedicated and enthusiastic person willing to commit himself in such fashion.

In closing may I thank Glenfiddich Whisky for their valued support and sponsorship, congratulate all the winners and wish everyone a pleasant evening and every success in the year of bowls ahead.

Report from Hon. Secretary H.K.L.B.A.

This past year has been another busy one for the Association seeing not only the usual keenly contested League and National Championships but also the revival of the Hong Kong International Bowls Classic. A main sponsor could still not be found for this event and so, in the middle of the year, the General Committee agreed to provide funds from its own general account to help finance the competition. Income was generated by way of a grant from the Sports Development Board and by increased entry fees for both the Singles and Pairs. For the first time ladies were invited to take part with two teams from overseas and two nominated by the Ladies Lawn Bowls Association of Hong Kong.

The classic lineup was probably the strongest ever and spectators were not to be disappointed by the quality of the matches. We all have our own memories of the event, but for me Graham Robertson's remarkable comeback victory against Cecil Bransky in the Singles Final and the outstanding bowls of both Israel and South Africa in the Pairs final took some beating. Truly memorable matches to complete a great week of bowls.

Hong Kong also took part in the 5th Pacific Bowls Championships in Victoria, B.C., Canada, a report of which can be found elsewhere in this Year Book.

In December, we hosted the Australian Under-25s to an inaugural Test Series at IRC, KBGC and KCC when many local bowlers had the opportunity of pitting their talents against a very strong visiting side. Although the results of 0-4, 1-3 and 2-2 were not in our overall favour, it was felt to be a very worthwhile exercise.

The National Summer League was sponsored by Glenfiddich Whisky and the number of teams increased by one to 42 from the 14 member clubs. As usual, each Division was keenly contested with many teams depending on their last matches to decide their fate. Congratulations to the respective Champions, Kowloon Bowling Green Club "A", Filipino Club "A", City Lawn Bowls Club "A" and Kowloon Bowling Green Club "D".

The National Winter League, despite the lack of a sponsor, proved to be equally competitive with the usual 24 teams taking part. Congratulations go not only to the respective overall winners, Indian Recreation Club "A", Victoria Lawn Bowls Club "A" and Kowloon Bowling Green Club "B", but also to the individual discipline winners. Thanks are extended to the National League Panel and in particular its Chairman Brian Poynton, who continues to work extremely hard every Saturday evening collating the results so that they can be published in the Sunday newspapers and be in the hands of the Conveners by late Saturday evening.

The National Championships were organised by the National Championships Panel under the Chairmanship of Vincent Cheung. The calendar of events ran smoothly due to the fine work put in by Vincent and his Panel and congratulations go to all the winners and finalists.

The coaching courses at Victoria Park, run in conjunction with the Urban Council, are now into their fifth year, with demand from the public becoming greater than ever. Courses are now being held every Sunday and every evening during the week. It is perhaps disappointing that once the coaching is completed and students have gained an interest in the sport, they find it very difficult to join a club. With still only one public facility available and private clubs difficult and expensive to join, the Association stands to lose many able and keen players. Hopefully some improvement can be made in mid-1994 when the new complex at Shatin opens. On the horizon, the Regional Council have plans to start another two-green complex in Taipo this year and have outline plans for more at Tuen Mun and Tin Shui Wai.

Coaching has also been provided for the physically handicapped, to staff of a number of large companies and societies, and, during the summer holidays, two schools sent interested children to learn the basics of the sport. In addition, the Short Mat game continues to increase in popularity with both the Urban and Regional Councils committed to expanding the sport to most of the Indoor Games Halls over the next few years. During 1993, the Association provided Short Mat coaching in Kowloon City, Kwun Tong, Peng Chau Island, Shatin, Taipo, Wong Tai Sin and Yau Tsim.

All this increase in interest being shown by both the Urban and Regional Councils, and the general public, would not be possible without the enthusiasm and hard work of the Chief Coach, Noorie Razack and his team of 32 coaches.

The post of Sports Executive was filled by Ian Chan on 1st April 1993 and although he brought with him a wealth of experience in the field of physical education, better opportunities presented themselves elsewhere and he resigned at the end of the year. The post was re-advertised and, as of 1st March 1994, Miss Emmy Wong will take up the responsibilities.

At the Annual General Meeting in March 1993, Roger Pickford and Noorie Razack were elected Life Members of the Association. Roger had been Honorary Treasurer for 10 years before leaving for Australia whilst Noorie was one of the first coaches at Victoria Park in 1979 and received the honour for this prolonged service to coaching.

Finally, the Association will move to new accommodation in April 1994 in Sports House along with the HKLLBA. This arrangement, together with the arrival of our new Sports Executive herald a new era and, hopefully, an improvement in the administration and overall efficiency of our sport.

The Blind Bowlers have also enjoyed a successful year. They returned with a Gold Medal in the Mixed Pairs at the World Blind Bowls Tournament held in Canada in September 1993.

A vote of appreciation goes to Lena Yeung and her helpers for the continued dedication and hardwork put into the training and organization of the bowlers.

As always, our thanks go to the H.K.L.B.A. for their continued support and co-operation throughout the year.

In the Singles, Noel finished 6th, only two points behind the winner and on equal points as the 3rd, 4th and 5th positioned players. He was extremely unlucky to have missed a medal, having beaten the eventual winner in his first match but dropped a couple of vital matches towards the end. In the Pairs, Noel and Mark had a very good run and entered the last match against Canada needing to win for the Gold. Unfortunately it was not to be and in losing by six shots they finished behind Australia and had to settle for the Bronze Medal.

The Triples also played well to finish in the middle of the table and with a little more good fortune, particularly in the four matches they lost on the final end, they would have been in for a chance of a medal.

The Fours had a very good tournament and, like the Pairs, entered their last match against Fiji needing a win for the Gold, a tie or defeat giving the Gold to Australia. The match was close all the way and entering the last end Hong Kong was one down on the board. Needing only to draw a second shot with the final bowl of the match, Mark trailed the jack but remained only one shot up for a tie and the Silver Medal.

With everyone taking home a medal and Hong Kong finishing 5th overall it was a creditable performance of which the team and Hong Kong can be proud.

The Hong Kong International Bowls Classic 1993

It was very late in the day that the HKLBA took the decision to hold the Classic again in 1993 after a three year break and to underwrite the expense to the tune of HK\$0.25m. Six clubs agreed to participate on the basis of a HK\$25,000.- entry fee which they were encouraged to acquire by way of sponsorship, the HKLLBA were invited to enter two sides on the same basis and the Classic Singles entries also paid a HK\$500.- donation entry fee to help the finances. Solid contributions from the Sports Development Board, Waco International, Cathay Pacific Airways and the Park Hotel enabled us to proceed confidently and we were also grateful for additional contribution by Boss Control Ltd., Swire Bottlers Ltd., Carlsberg, Hongkong Telecom, China Light & Power Co. Ltd. and Lawn Bowls East.

With the disappearance of the HKFC green, KCC hosted the Singles on 6th and 7th November and an Opening Ceremony at which Sir David Ford, the Acting Governor officiated.

The Singles competition duly saw a number of upsets, notably Pat Chan removing John Bell and a good run by Lena Yeung into the quarter-finals, but the semi-finalists were four of the favourites. The Final turned out to be an all time Classic, the likes of which will hardly be seen again at this level of the game. The sad thing was that it was not recorded on video as it would have served as a burning example to all bowlers concerning fighting spirit and determination to overcome. Initially it looked as though a whitewash was on the cards with Cecil Bransky of Israel galloping to a 24-4 lead in little more than an hour over a lacklustre Graham Robertson of Scotland, the holder. Suddenly, however, the tide changed and the Scot began to eat away at the deficit converting game-down positions nine times with his final delivery. Over the next 13 ends, he managed, not only the improbable of winning all, but also the seemingly impossible by winning the match 25-24 and retaining his title. To be at this game was a stunning experience and both bowlers should be honoured to have taken part in such a spectacle.

The well-known format of Pairs competition commenced on 8th November with sectional play through until the morning of the 13th when the quarter-finalists became clear.

On the Saturday afternoon we saw four closely fought knock-out fixtures with the following results:-

On the Sunday 13th November and the conclusion of the week's action. The semi-finals saw Israel easily overcome Wales 26-8 and South Africa account for Hong Kong 20-13.

Very much a South African event with both Israelis former South African citizens, it was a fine example of tight, high class bowling played in a marvellous spirit and with some exceptional bowls from both Skips Kevin Campbell of SA and Jeff Rabkin. It was not until the penultimate end on which the latter executed a delightful shot to convert an adverse situation that Israel edged ahead and enabled them to snatch the title and give Cecil Bransky some consolation for his traumatic Singles experience. In defeat, Askley Van Ginkel and Kevin Campbell, bringing South Africa to the Classic for the first time, were excellent bowlers and ambassadors for their country and no doubt will get another chance to grace our greens.

With fine weather throughout, the revival of the Classic, with probably the finest field ever, was an undoubted success and once again gave Hong Kong bowlers a tremendous opportunity, not only to play against, but also to see the world's best in action.

We look forward eagerly to the next Classic due to be held between 5th and 13th November 1994.

Craigengower Cricket Club Centenary

The Club was founded in 1894 when Mr. W.D. Braidwood, the Headmaster of the Victoria English School converted a turfed piece of ground into a cricket field in Bonham Road near Breezy Point. This enthusiastic group of cricketers were given the name of Craigengower by Mr. Braidwood after the building which housed his school.

The ground was obviously small and the bordering cemetery proved to be an unpopular place for the students to retrieve their ball ! Mr. Braidwood therefore sought an alternative and settled upon an area in the north-east corner of Happy Valley which was being used for various recreational activities including those of the Royal Hong Kong Jockey Club.

Eventually four clubs shared the area of land north of Sports Road for cricket during the cricket season when all lawn bowls were stopped. Indeed this arrangement continued until the late 60's when CCC and the PRC often played back-to-back cricket matches and all bowls had to stop.

The original Club House, with a hall and bowling green next to the bar were made possible by generous donations from Mr. W. Bradbury, the Parsee community and support from local cricketers and people from the Naval Dockyard and Taikoo Sugar Refinery. During the War the Club House was bombed and finally demolished by the Japanese, but two years after the War the lease was resumed and a bar, lounge and small changing room were erected.

From an original 200 members, membership now stands at 2000 and facilities now include Indoor Bowling, Outdoor Bowls, Carpark, Changing Rooms, Bar, Function Rooms and Western and Chinese Dining Rooms.

Kowloon Cricket Club Ninetieth Anniversary

An unlikely meeting on 4th October 1904 at the Seaman's Institute was the conception of KCC when it was decided to seek land from Government to play cricket in Kowloon. At the outset 75 members joined and in 1905 the accounts showed a profit of \$442.00!

A pavilion was opened by the Governor Sir Frederick Lugard in 1908 and the cricket and lawn bowls sections continued to grow and prosper.

The present Clubhouse was opened in 1932 with membership around the 390 mark.

The Club fared badly during the War but over the years it was slowly brought back to its former standard and then improved. Current membership stands at around 1600.

KCC became involved in lawn bowls almost at its inception but the Section was not officially inaugurated until 1918 with a match against KBGC for spoons and War Bond tickets. The Club won the 2nd Division title in 1926 and 1927 and then the 1st in 1931. In 1950 the Club took the unprecedented step of allowing ladies to play and this was soon favoured by most other clubs!

During the 1980s, the Club became a major force on the bowling scene in league, national championships and representative teams both with men and ladies, and it looks forward to a continued strong showing as it moves towards its Centenary.

The lawn bowling fraternity extends sincere congratulations to KCC on the occasion of this landmark in its history.
